



The New York State Energy Research and Development Authority (NYSERDA) and dozens of partners have invested millions of dollars to develop energy efficiency and renewable energy training centers across the State.

Training a green workforce to install clean energy technologies and energy efficiency improvements is a top priority for NYSERDA, and will ensure that we get the greatest amount of energy savings from energy efficient improvements and production from renewable energy systems.

Training is being provided by community colleges, unions, associations, technical high schools, and through Centers for Energy Efficiency and Building Science (CEEBS), where the energy efficiency classes are recognized by the Building Performance Institute (BPI). Some renewable energy programs are accredited by the Institute for Sustainable Power Quality (ISPQ).

Courses include building science principles, as well as energy efficiency, photovoltaics, solar thermal, geothermal, small and large wind, fuel cells, and anaerobic digestion.

New York State has set ambitious statewide goals for becoming more energy efficient and using cleaner, renewable energy. A highly trained green workforce will enable New York to achieve these goals, which include saving money, creating jobs, and improving the environment.
